Meet Me at the Library: A conversation with Pima County Supervisor Ann Day

Supervisor Ann Day, who has held her post as the District 1 representative on the Pima County Board of Supervisors for three terms, will speak and meet with community members at the Library's next "Meet Me at the Library: Conversations with Arizona Leaders" event on Thursday, July 28.

The session will take place from 6 -7 p.m. at the Nanini Branch Library, 7300 N. Shannon Road. The event is free and open to the public.

Day was first elected as the District 1 Supervisor in November 2000. The District's boundaries run north of the Rillito River to the Pima-Pinal county line and east of Interstate 10 to one mile east of Sabino Canyon Road. It includes the Town of Oro Valley, the eastern portion of Marana and the unincorporated communities of Catalina Foothills, Tortolita, Casa Adobes and Catalina.

Meet Me at the Library is an opportunity for people to meet elected officials and other community leaders. Day may discuss her role as a supervisor, as well as the past, present and future of Tucson, District 1 and Arizona.

In addition to her work on the Board of Supervisors, Day also served in the Arizona State Senate for 10 years and was the first woman appointed to the State Industrial Commission.

She holds a bachelor's degree from Arizona State University and a master's degree in counseling and guidance from the University of Arizona. During her career she taught junior high school and worked with families in crisis as a marriage and family therapist with the Pima County Conciliation Court.

Her family roots in Arizona are deep. She grew up on the Lazy B cattle ranch in eastern Arizona, which was started by her grandfather in 1880 and which remained within the family for 114 years.
