**July 2022** 

The Library's Bookbike and Seed Library celebrated their 10th anniversaries. The teams co-authored a blog post about the impact these services have made on the community as well as members' reflections about what working on the teams has meant to them.


#### November 2022

January 2023

April 2023

On April 15, the Library partnered with <u>Galeria</u> <u>Mitotera</u> and <u>REFORMA</u> Tucson Chapter for the Día del Niñe program, which included a book giveaway and a culturally-relevant craft station. In total, 447 books—in Spanish and bilingual—were distributed.

April 2023

During National Library Week, library services manager Kate D.L. published a blog post—<u>Your, and everyone's, freedom to read</u>—about book bans. In it, she said, "We exist to do the greatest good for the greatest possible number of people in our community, and we know that allowing ideas to be freely tested by each individual for relevance to their own needs returns the best results."

May 2023

On May 6, the library collaborated with Galeria Mitotera during the Maíz Fiesta at Kennedy Park. This event offered an opportunity for multiple Library affinity teams—Welcome to America, Many Nations, Seed Library—to connect with the community and demonstrate our ongoing commitment to diverse programming and services.

May 2023

To celebrate Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month, Biblio Lotus and the Seed Library, in partnership with Mission Garden, hosted a seed swap featuring Asian heritage seeds. The event on Saturday, May 27, offered community members a chance to pick up Grab n Grow Kits, which included heirloom seeds and recipes.
