## SUBJECT: Community Engagement and Outreach Report – February 2024

Pima County Public Library (PCPL) collaborated with the Greater Southern Arizona Area Chapter (GSAAC) of the Buffalo Soldiers 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Horse Cavalry Association to host informational displays at over 15 libraries, some of the displays including storyboards and sculptures were borrowed from the Association. Many of these displays will be ongoing through March.

PCPL helped plan Pima County's Employee's Black History Month Celebration on Thursday, February 22 at the Old County Courthouse. The library hosted an outreach table holding the interest of kids in attendance, and the Bead-Bracelet craft was well received.

PCPL hosted its 8<sup>th</sup> Career Online High School Graduation on February 17 at the Murphy-Wilmot Library. Twelve of the 20+ graduates were in attendance along with 125 family and friends. One graduate shared that two generations in her family have completed this degree her Aunt graduated in 2018!
